FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

How do I apply?

By completing and returning the application form in this pack to Revival Fires, together with a Pastor's Reference Form from your pastor. You can also download these forms online at www.revivalfires.org.uk. Remember to enclose the fee of £50 with your application form. Application deadline is Wed 16 December 2009. Late applications will be considered subject to places being available.

Is the school open to all ages?

Yes, we accept applications from all people over the age of 18 and from all walks of life. That's you!

Do I have to pay all of my fees at registration?

Fees are payable on 12 January (£1,000) and 1 April (£1,000). In certain circumstances, it may be possible to pay for each term in instalments.

Is the school residential?

No, the school is not residential in the sense that everyone is together all the time in one location. There is, however, a student house which accommodates students in shared rooms. To rent a room may cost you around £50 a week.

How much money will I need for personal spending?

On average, you will need about £25 per week for your own food costs, plus your own personal spending money.

Do I buy my own food?

Yes. In the student house there is a shared kitchen. Students often choose to make meals and eat together.

Can I work part-time during my course of study at Revival Fires?

It is possible to work part time. Various casual vacancies arise from time to time in the town and at Merry Hill shopping centre, which is a short bus ride

away. You will be free most Saturdays and some evenings. If you do work, however, you will have a very busy schedule.

How does the programme look?

Monday is a private study day. The course runs from 9.30am Tuesday – Friday until 1pm. We start the day with worship then teaching starts at 10am until around 1pm. You will be taught by a variety of speakers. Some sessions will be practical. On Tuesday and Thursday afternoons you will be working in a serving role at Revival Fires. You will also be part of our healing clinic teams, praying for people in our walk-in clinic. Other afternoons cover group work, book reviews, tutorials etc.

How many hours will I have to study and work each day?

On Mondays from 9am to 5pm, you will work on assignments and do private study. On Tuesday to Friday teaching will be from 9.30am to 1pm. On some days, you will serve Revival Fires for a few additional hours in the afternoon. You will attend evening meetings as they occur. Saturday is a free day in general. On Sunday morning you attend church at the ARC and then Sunday afternoon is free. You will also be an integral part of our conference team.

Will I receive ministry team training?

Yes, you will attend a course where we teach you how to minister as part of the Revival Fires ministry team. This will release you for a wide range of ministry opportunities both inside and outside of the church.

Does the course involve a lot of academic study?

Revival Fires is not a Bible school. The course involves a certain amount of academic study. You will also be required to read set books, write short book reviews and prepare for discussions.

Will I need a laptop?

A laptop is not essential but would be useful. The ARC has wireless access to the internet, which is available to students free of charge. There are computers with internet access at Dudley public library. There is not, at present, internet access at the student house.

How can I serve Revival Fires during the school?

On the school you will learn what it is to serve from the heart. You will be asked to help in various areas of the ministry (coffee shop, bookshop, resources, children's work, administration, reception, hospitality, cleaning, assisting leadership), making use of your gifts and talents. Past students have found this aspect of the course tremendously rewarding and invaluable in their personal growth.

What about ministry trips?

Several ministry trips occur during your school year. We suggest you attend as many of the UK weekends as you can, and at least one international trip. Trips are costed separately.

How do I find out about the ministry trips?

You will be given a calendar of the mission and conferences on admission, with a cost guide for each trip.

What pastoral support will I receive while on the school?

The senior pastors at Revival Fires are Trevor and Sharon Baker. They will have input into the school, as well as other staff members and renowned speakers. In addition, the pastoral team will be available to pastor students on day to day issues.

Will I have a personal mentor?

No, but there is opportunity to build relationship with and obtain support from Life Group leaders within the church.

Can I do the School part time?

Yes it is possible to do parts of the school. Each week covers a different topic and we recommend, if you wish to become a part-time student, that you follow complete weeks of study.

Is there accreditation for this course?

At the end of the course you will receive a certificate which would enable you, should you so wish, to use as part of the assessment needed to qualify for a degree at the Christian Leadership University in Buffalo, New York, USA. Other assessments can be completed by correspondence at any time after leaving the school.

Is there any free time in the school schedule?

There are Easter and Summer breaks.

What do I need to bring with me?

Most of all bring an open and teachable heart. Bring all of yourself! We are so blessed to have you on the course! In addition to the obvious daily needs, please bring your own bedding, a laptop if you have one, an alarm clock, a Bible and a pen!

Do I need to bring my car?

A car is good, if you have one, but by no means essential. There is parking at the ARC and limited parking at the student house
